What to Expect in an Interview

...the interview is all about you - be ready to talk about yourself and to be composed.

... to talk about employment gaps and periods between jobs in the best light possible.

... to describe projects you've been involved in.

... to bring questions of your own - this is your opportunity to interview the company and find out if this is somewhere you can really see yourself working.

Common Interview Questions

- Can you tell me a little about yourself?
- Why did you leave your last job?
- How did you hear about this position?
- Why do you want to work for our company?
- Why are you the best person for this job?
- What are your greatest strengths and weaknesses?



Questions to Ask During an Interview

Ask questions regarding the duties and requirements

of the position, such as:

- What are you looking for in a candidate?
- How would you describe a typical day in this position?
- What are the biggest challenges of the job?

Ask questions related to the office structure:

- How many people work in the office/department?
- Who does this position report to?
- What is the company's management style?

Ask questions regarding the culture:

- How does the company promote diversity?
- What is the best part of working for this company?
- Is there a prayer space?
- What type of background do you feel is best suited for success in this position?

Ask questions regarding promotion:

- What kinds of opportunities are there for growth within the company?
- How does one advance in the company?

Questions not to ask:

- What does the company do? (Do your research ahead of time!)
- When can I take time off?

Tips for a Great Interview

Standing out

- Research the company show how you can be a good addition to the company.
- Dress for success follow the dress code, and show your personality.
- Arrive early for your interview.
- Showcase your strengths and areas for improvement.
- Talk about more than what's on your resume describe your accomplishments.
- Ask the right questions show interest and ask insightful questions.
- Be aware of your body language.

Virtual Interviews

- Log on on-time.
- Set up your space consider your background, check for reliable internet, and be comfortable with the online platform.
- Make eye contact, stay focused, and be visibly engaged.

More Tips to Feel Prepared

- Know your worth remember your value and the potential you have for the job.
- Be aware of potential biases and discrimination be ready to address it, but don't be discouraged.
- Practice your interview answers, especially if you have little experience, to help build confidence.
- Network build connections and expand your network.
