## Wildfire Response Guidelines

As the wildfire progresses, your community will face increasing risk. Use this guideline to think about what resources you need to respond to the changing situation.

Wildfire Levels	Immediate Actions	Secondary Actions
<b>Level 0</b> No Wildfire Risk	Lowest wildfire risk, no action needed-	-address the Community Challenge.
Level 1 Low Wildfire Risk	<ul> <li>Task a: Send alert with <u>automated alert/notice</u> <u>system</u> via email, social media, reverse 911</li> <li>Task b: <u>Volunteer teams</u> ready to move equipment to emergency coordination center </li> <li>Task c: Confirm <u>alternate evacuation routes</u></li> <li>Task d: <u>Emergency personnel</u> on alert and ready</li> <li>Task e: Request additional <u>police officers</u> to be available with traffic redirection</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Task f: Have road signs or road barricades ready to deploy to fire-threatened roadways</li> <li>Task g: Volunteer team ready to help with evacuation </li> <li>Task h: Arrange alternative school facilities</li> </ul>
Level 2 Moderate Wildfire Risk	<ul> <li>Task a: Send alert with <u>automated alert/notice</u> <u>system</u></li> <li>Task b: Deploy <u>volunteer teams</u> to evacuate people and businesses in the wildfire zone </li> <li>Task c: Move <u>industrial fire hose</u> to fire line</li> <li>Task d: Use <u>road barricades</u> to close fire-threatened roads</li> <li>Task e: Arrange <u>alternative school facilities</u></li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Task f: Identify the closest <u>water reservoirs</u></li> <li>Task g: Assemble <u>volunteer safety supplies</u></li> <li>Task h: Coordinate a <u>volunteer team</u> to assist those who need help evacuating or protecting their homes </li> </ul>
Level 3 High Wildfire Risk	<ul> <li>Task a: Send alert with <u>automated alert/notice</u> <u>system</u></li> <li>Task b: Provide <u>volunteer safety supplies</u> to volunteers</li> <li>Task c: Make <u>state emergency response request</u></li> <li>Task d: Access city's <u>water reservoirs</u></li> <li>Task e: Use a <u>volunteer team</u> to assist those who need help evacuating or protecting their homes (</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Task f: Designate <u>alternative evacuation</u> route</li> <li>Task g: Set up <u>emergency shelters &amp;</u> <u>supplies</u></li> <li>Task h: Place firefighting crews on standby</li> </ul>
Level 4 Highest Wildfire Risk	<ul> <li>Task a: Send alert with <u>automated alert/notice</u> <u>system</u> with wildfire risk info and evacuation route</li> <li>Task b: Coordinate <u>firefighting crews</u> to protect vulnerable homes</li> <li>Task c: Activate <u>emergency shelters &amp; supplies</u></li> <li>Task d: Activate <u>public transportation system</u> for assistance with evacuation</li> <li>Task e: Deploy <u>medic team</u> to residents with smoke- related medical conditions</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Task f: Police officers monitor roadways to ensure that evacuees can get out</li> <li>Task g: Deploy additional road signs to help with increases in evacuation efforts</li> <li>Task h: Activate secondary volunteer teams to support first responders (childcare, etc.) </li> </ul>



**Individual Resource Cards:** Symbol indicates task where Individual Resource Card can replace Community Resource Card.



**FLARE-UP:** When a flare-up occurs (a new area catches fire), your town will need the following to fight it:

- Industrial water hoses or helicopter with fire retardant
- <u>Volunteer team</u> to help clear flammable items
- <u>4x4 vehicles</u> to transport supplies and volunteers to affected area

## Plus at least one of the following:

- 1 medic team to assist
- 1 emergency coordinator
- 5 hand tool sets (shovels, saws, axes)

You can use a <u>Fire-Resistant Construction</u> or <u>Defensible Space</u> card to contain the flare-up.
